MINUTES OF THE SOUTH DEVON AONB ESTUARIES STEERING GROUP MEETING

HELD AT FOLLATON HOUSE ON WEDNESDAY 8th MAY 2019

1. INTRODUCTIONS AND APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE

The AONB Manager added that due to recent elections there would be no elected member representing South Hams District Council.

2. NOTES OF THE LAST MEETING (6th NOVEMBER 2018) AND ANY MATTERS ARISING

- 2.01 Action 1 (RE) The AONB Manager attended a meeting on 18th December 2018 with development planners from South Hams District Council. Part of the meeting discussed improvements that could be made in planning cases with MMO interaction. It is thought the first response containing revised wording will be for a development on the Dart estuary where a pontoon application is anticipated.
 - Action 1 (RC): Ruth Crundwell offered to add wording to NE responses on terrestrial and marine planning where it goes into the intertidal area.
- 2.02 Action 2 (NM) To arrange a workshop with NE and the EA to determine an approach to encourage consistency when responding to marine planning applications. The Estuaries Officer informed members that there had been no success in making arrangements to date, however this will be useful so continued efforts will be made.
- 2.03 Action 3 (NM) Exeter University presented at the spring SKEF meeting. It is anticipated they will also present at the autumn meeting with a focus on how red tides on Salcombe Kingsbridge estuary could be managed going forward.

- 2.04 Action 4 (CS) There was some concern that there is no formal method of feedback to Defra allowing points to be addressed for the next round MCZ consultations. It was felt that concerns raised from the 2012 consultation had not been addressed and therefore were still present in the current round. RC informed members the challenge is the MCZ consultation process is run by Defra with NE advising on the designation.
 - Action 2 (RC): Find out whether any progress made by Christine Singfield.
- 2.05 Action 5 (all): The AONB Manger informed members that DCC and South Devon AONB each submitted responses to the Protected Landscapes Review call for evidence. A panel member, Lord Cameron of Dillington visited a number of AONBs' including South Devon. Particular interest was shown in the Estuaries Management Plan and the Heritage Coast. Lord Cameron praised the Estuary Steering Group for its accountability and sharing. Report conclusion is expected in September.
 - i. The Dart Harbour Master informed members that DHNA are refreshing their strategic plan. A high percentage of returned stakeholder survey forms were concerned with the environment. MC would like the current level of alignment with the South Devon AONB Estuaries Management Plan continue. The AONB Manager informed members the project to update the South Devon AONB Management Plan included a consultation across a wide community and would hope that there would be correlation with the DHNA stakeholder responses.
- 2.06 Action 6 (MC) To request LiDAR data if required.
 - i. The AONB Manager informed members that LiDAR data is available online.
 - Action 3 (RE): Distribute link -

- ii. Simon Roper, AMBIOS, may have historical data that could be made available to DHNA.
- iii. South Devon College may have funding to strengthen relationships between Devon/Cornwall and France.
- iv. Paul Singer, who now sends students to France to further their knowledge in the yacht industry, has knowledge of how to find possible funding for activities.
- v. Interreg funding opportunities are now past so the potential for other opportunities needs to be investigated.

Action 4 (MC): Contact Simon Roper to explore what historical data is held and pass contact details for Paul Singer to RE.

- 2.07 Action 7 (RE) Draw up a Memorandum of Agreement that incorporates a clause on required notice to invoke an RPI increase in funding. The AONB Manager informed members that the RPI increase will not be triggered for the current years funding, detail in agenda item 5.
- 2.08 Action 8 (MC) To contact the AONB Estuaries Officer is assistance needed when supporting University sea bass project. The Dart Harbour Master informed members that DHNA had not been involved however he understands the tagging exercise was successful.
- 2.09 Action 9 & 10 (KP) Devon Maritime Forum

MC attended the DMF conference held in February.

2.10 Action 11 (NM) – Voluntary agreement regarding the Dart estuary Mew Stone and seal disturbance.

Voluntary agreement not traced however a Dart Estuary Environmental Management (DEEM) leaflet, compiled with assistance from Stephen Westcott, has been found.

Action 5 (NM): Distribute a copy of DEEM's seal watching leaflet.

3. ESTUARY OFFICER'S CURRENT ACTIVITY REPORT AND PRIORITIES FOR THE NEXT PERIOD

- 3.1 The AONB Estuaries Officer gave a report on activity that has taken place since the autumn meeting. A full list was provided within the meeting papers. In discussion:
 - i. South Devon AONB Estuaries funding partners are
 - Dart Harbour Navigation Authority

- o Salcombe Harbour Authority
- o Devon County Council
- o South Hams District Council
- National Trust
- o Defra
- Duchy of Cornwall
- Westcountry Rivers Trust for catchment management projects (hosting)
- ii. Although not leading on marine plastic and litter, the South Devon AONB will be involved, however marine waste issues are much wider plastic pollution alone.
- iii. Estuaries Officer involvement with Parish Councils
 - o Encourage Parish Councils to monitor their areas, reporting changes or concerns.
 - Communicate to all Parish Councils around the estuaries to look at facilities linked to developments;
 encourage sustainable drainage schemes and report any run-off during the construction process.

iv. Harbour Guides

- There are two articles in the Yealm harbour guide including one on seagrass. These pages in the are now published free of charge.
- o The information provided for this years Salcombe Harbour guide includes information on jellyfish.
- v. The Estuaries Management Plan is now a formal annex to the revised South Devon AONB Management Plan, launch event taking place on 24th May.
- vi. Seaweed farm application
 - o The AONB has been formally consulted on this application and the Estuaries Officer has responded.
 - Although not formally in the DHNA area, the Dart Harbour Authority responded to this application with suggestions on how the area could be lit.
 - The AONB Manager informed members that the LVIA for this application was lacking in some detail.
 The MMO will look at what was required on this so they can apply the knowledge elsewhere.

vii. Pacific oyster project

- o There is interest in Pacific oyster removal, in particular on the Yealm which has the greater issue. The focus is on the foreshore in front of the harbour office.
- Encouraging Pacific oyster surveys around the coast, generating a heat map of dots to easily see where the greater populations are found.
- Looking into whether removed oysters can be grown on, also to see if the shell can be used as a fertiliser additive.
- There are a high number of volunteers on the Salcombe Kingsbridge estuary where new seagrass areas have been found during survey work.
- MC reported there are Pacific oysters by the double steps in Dartmouth that can be easily viewed and photographed from the pontoon at low tide.
 - Action 6 (??): Take regular photographs to monitor spread.
- A question was raised how schools could be actively engaged to look out for invasive species such as the Chinese mitten crab. The AONB has a 'crabbing with kindness' poster. As well as educating on how to do this responsibly, this also shows how to sex a crab as well as encouraging people to report anything unusual.
 - Action 7 (NM): Send 'crabbing with kindness' notices to MC.
- A workshop was held for the Pacific oyster project volunteers enabling them to identify some of the other invasive non-native species. Volunteers are encouraged to get to know their area and report change.

viii. Sharpham salt marsh retaining wall

The first of two free drone flights, offered by Plymouth Marine Laboratory, took place a couple of months prior to the meeting. A second flight will survey for changes, looking specifically at accretion and erosion within the creeks.

- ix. Plymouth Sound National Marine Park
 - Stage 1 is close to Plymouth Sound. Stage 2 would cover a much larger area.
 - o Glover review said this could be a model.
 - o The overlap with other designations complicates things. There is a need for existing management bodies to be part of the structure, including catchments.
 - A further consultation is expected soon.
- x. BioBlitz 2019 will take place at Wembury on 27-28 September.

Action 8 (NM): Find out if a Sharpham BioBlitz is planned for this year.

- xi. Marine Conservation Zone outcomes are due to be announced in June
- xii. The AONB Manager went through the priorities for the next six months as outlined in the agenda papers. In discussion
 - Look at ways of conserving seagrass off East Portlemouth. Potential for swimming/snorkelling areas that also serve to protect seagrass from boats.
 - Map recently discovered areas of seagrass.
 - o Continue to reach out for Pacific Oyster project volunteers for the Dart.
 - Construct an environment management plan document that includes guidance on acceptable mitigation measures.

4. ESTUARIES AND CATCHMENT PRIORITIES FOR THE NEXT 12 MONTHS AND LONGER TERM

- 4.1 The AONB has funding to trial ideas for habitat enhancement on steel piled walls. The proposed structure at Noss on Dart has changed and can no longer be used for this project. Other ideas include rock armour mitigation. MC suggested that DHNA may also be able to provide funding for the right project
- 4.2 The Dart Harbour Master indicated where a breach in the Sharpham salt marsh retaining wall could result in the river cutting through for a more direct flow. The

Action 9 (NM): Look into possible prevention/mitigation in advance of the second drone flight.

Action 10 (MC): Arrange a meeting between the AONB Estuaries Officer and those that recall bow creek

5. FINANCIAL REPORT AND BUDGET

6. "ROUND THE TABLE" UPDATES

- 6.1 The DHNA Harbour Master reported the following:
 - i. Coastal Communities Fund bid to upgrade the standard fishing pontoons failed as DHNA were unable to demonstrate increase in employment. The bid was to support the fishing industry:
 - a. install replacement pontoons having a higher freeboard able to accommodate ships up to 120 tonnes.
 - b. improve safety by installing lighting and CCTV
- 6.2 Kirstie Pritchard updated Members with the following:
 - i. Historic Environment
 - a. CITiZAN (Coastal & inter-tidal archaeology project, Museum of London Archaeology) First Local Network meeting on Thursday 30th May in Exeter.
 - b. TIDE (European Atlantic regions coastal heritage & tourism project Armada, Napoleonic, U-Boat warfare, trans-Atlantic migrations) Start up meeting 14th May in Exeter.

- c. Al&MP Moor to Shore Phase 1 (mapping of archaeology from aerial photos) Haldon Ridge to Dart valley completed. Draft report with Historic England for comment. Summary of project findings is on the DCC Historic Environment Team web pages.
- ii. Climate change predictions.
 - a. The 2018 climate projections for the UK were published in December. This is a 10-year update on previous predictions. A comparison of the new projections with the old for the South West show the only real difference to cause some concern is that sea level rise projections for the second half of the 21st century are between 1.5 and 2 times bigger than previously projected.

Action 12 (KP): Circulate climate projection report.

6.3 Ruth Crundwell informed members

- i. Christine Singfield is on a career break, due to return March 2020. All are requested to use the Devon, Cornwall and Isles of Scilly email address.
 - Action 13 (RC): Circulate link to Devon, Cornwall and Isles of Scilly email address
- ii. Ruth Porter is covering some of Christine's work areas, including representation on the Estuary Steering Group.
- iii. Seagrass survey is complete, draft report is being finalised.
- iv. Defra are expected to announce the designation of the third tranche of Marine Conservation Zones (MCZs) in June.
- v. Coastal access documents for the Yealm, Erme and Avon are being released. The premise is to use existing paths and ferries and the South West Coast Path when ferries are not available. The AONB Manager added that the ferries on the Yealm and Avon have very limited hours of operation, something that was being looked into by Natural England (Jane).
 - <u>Action 14 (RC)</u>: Circulate coastal access documents and liaise with Jane regarding ferry operations on the Yealm and Avon.
- vi. Kingswear to Lyme Regis report is with Defra and the Secretary of State.
